Regional Training & Exercise Program Overview

On July 15, 2011, the 2010 MOU between the Alameda County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) and the San Francisco Bay Area UASI (UASI) was finalized, officially establishing the commencement of the Bay Area UASI Regional Training & Exercise Program managed by the Alameda County Sheriff's Office.

The Alameda County Sheriff's Office provides and manages a sustainable regional training and exercise program for the Bay Area UASI program, serving multi-disciplines including; Law Enforcement, Fire, EMS, Public Health and Emergency Management.

Published reports and guidelines such as those prepared by State and Federal Agencies, as well as the Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan, the Risk Assessment Capability (RAC) Report, and other documents specifically prepared for the Approval Authority, were utilized in the development of the Regional Training & Exercise Program. All plans, guidance documents and training shall conform with, and are consistent with, the California Incident Command System (ICS), Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS), National Incident Management System (NIMS), the National Infrastructure Protection Plan (NIPP), and the National Response Framework (NRF).

Goals: The Training and Exercise Planning Workgroup Members engage in a fair, open, and transparent process throughout the planning, vetting and implementation phases. The Workgroup makes certain that products and services rendered are: equitably and geographically distributed; are at reasonable cost(s) (including Instructor Rates); meet the regional training needs and gaps; while ensuring fair market competition for its vendors.

Vision: To promote, encourage and provide training and exercise opportunities for our emergency response workforce, ensuring our workforce is maintained in a state of readiness and competency for all communities within the 12 County Bay Area UASI Region.

Mission: Utilizing the Regional Training & Exercise Program's Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan, the Alameda County Sheriff's Office, on behalf of the Bay Area UASI Program, will promote equitable and geographical distribution of Training and Exercise Funds amongst various agencies and disciplines within the 12 County UASI Region.

Key Achievements

Training & Exercise Staffing

The Regional Training & Exercise Program has maintained full staffing levels since January 2012. Prior to January 2012, one Training/Exercise Planner position was left vacant to allow Oakland to provide a staff member to fill the position. In late January 2012, the vacant position was temporarily filled when the Regional Training & Exercise Program staff acquired Marla Blagg from the Alameda County Fire Department. In November 2012, Marla Blagg vacated the Training/Exercise Planner position and the Regional Training & Exercise Program is currently working with the City of Oakland to fill the vacant position.

Regional Interim Training Plan

The Regional Interim Training Plan was developed for immediate implementation while the Bay Area's Regional Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan was being developed.

On June 29, 2011, in preparation for the Regional Training & Exercise Program being officially established, the CBRNE/Training & Exercise Working Group held a vetting session of 40 course proposals, which were prioritized by the Training & Exercises Working Group and placed on a list recommended for approval by the Regional Training & Exercise Program. On October 20, 2011, the CBRNE/Training & Exercise Working Group held another vetting session and prioritized an additional 32 course proposals. These courses were researched, developed, and submitted to the Bay Area UASI Approval Authority for approval and implementation.

These vetting sessions established the Interim Training Plan and assisted with the development of the 2012 Annual Training Plan, which was managed by the Regional Training & Exercise Program staff and updated as necessary.

Office & Equipment



The Regional Training & Exercise staff acquired office space at the Alameda County Sheriff's Office Regional Training Center, located at 6289 Madigan Road, Classroom G, Dublin, CA 94568. Cubicles, computer systems and other applicable office supplies were procured. The Regional Training & Exercise Program utilized the Alameda County Property and Salvage to obtain surplus stock for cubicles and office furniture at no cost. Computers were originally obtained through the Alameda County Sheriff's Office surplus stock at no charge. Based on the age and performance of the computers, new computers were purchased in 2012 using M&A money.

Regional Training & Exercise Website (www.bauasitep.org)

The Regional Training & Exercise Program Planning & Research Coordinator developed a website for both computers and mobile devices, which allows regional stakeholders to create a user account, view and register for available courses, submit course proposals for the workgroup vetting process and receive emailed course announcements. The development of this website has allowed users from all areas of the Bay Area UASI region to have an equal and fair opportunity to receive the training courses offered by the Regional Training & Exercise Program and has been extremely successful in distributing information regarding course availability. By December 2012, over 3,500 stakeholders from throughout the region have created user accounts and have access to training opportunities. The website also allows the Training & Exercise Program staff to access up to date statistics and monitor ongoing progress.

Training Providers

The Regional Training & Exercise Program worked with the Alameda County GSA to establish an “Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity” procurement process to establish a pre-approved training provider list to assist in with the process of acquiring and reimbursing training providers.

In accordance with the Alameda County GSA purchasing policies and procedures a Request for Quotations (RFQ) was posted on the Alameda County web page as well as mailed to numerous training vendors. Following receipt from the responding vendors, a Request for Proposals (RFP) was posted on the Alameda County web page. Invitations were sent to the vendors for a question & answer session to clarify any concerns or issues prospective vendors may have had concerning the contract requirements and/or deliverables. Upon evaluation of the proposals individual bidders conferences were held using pre-established baseline questions developed by County GSA. As a result of the proposals and bidders conferences, 15 training vendors were pre-qualified by County GSA and are eligible for UASI T&E funded training contract awards. The Alameda County Board of Supervisors approved the contracts on January 24, 2012.

Training Activities

The Training & Exercise Planners have worked with regional stakeholders to procure and calendar training courses throughout the Bay Area UASI region. The Training & Exercise Planners obtained feedback numbers, submitted all required EHP memorandums, ensured facilities and curriculum materials were available and required all pertinent documentation (sign-in sheets, agendas, course evaluations) to be returned to the Training & Exercise Program in accordance to audit requirements. Training & Exercise staff have also occasionally audited and observed courses to ensure proper delivery and course subject matter was appropriate.

Policies & Procedures

The Regional Training & Exercise staff developed a Guidance Manual, which established policies and procedures to assist regional stakeholders with a broad understanding of requirements, including, but not limited to, the proposal and vetting processes, website registration and usage, vendor contact information, reimbursement requirements, and the responsibilities, expectations, and acceptable behavior of students attending courses. The Guidance Manual was submitted to, and approved by, the Bay Area UASI Advisory Group, who serves as the Regional Training & Exercise Program’s Executive Steering Committee, and the Bay Area UASI Approval Authority.

Multi-Year Training & Exercise Plan

The Regional Training & Exercise Program conducted a competitive bidding process to select a vendor to develop a Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan (3-year plan). As a result of the competitive bidding process, Louisiana State University was selected to produce the report. However, during the development of the contract, attorneys from Alameda County and Louisiana State University could not arrive at an agreement regarding the indemnification language, therefore a contract could not be awarded. The Regional Training & Exercise Program then selected Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC), who was awarded the contract. The Regional Training & Exercise Program met with SAIC and developed a project timeline with a completion

date by August 2012. In preparation for the creation of the Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan, a Steering Committee was established with key stakeholders within the Bay Area UASI Region.

On June 12, 2012 a Project Planning Meeting was held with the Regional Training & Exercise Program and SAIC to discuss the overall goal of the project, identify members to be included in the Regional Multi-Year Training and Exercise Steering Committee, and to determine the project timeline.

On June 27, 2012, a Project Kickoff Meeting was also conducted with the Regional Training & Exercise Program, SAIC and the Steering Committee to introduce them to the project, receive initial feedback on the approach, identify training and exercise documents to review, and discuss the format for the HSEEP-compliant Training and Exercise Planning Workshop.

On July 31, 2012, a Training and Exercise Planning Workshop was conducted by SAIC to gather, compile, and analyze training and exercise needs necessary for inclusion in the Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan. Approximately 100 key stakeholders from the Bay Area UASI region attended the Training and Exercise Planning Workshop. Attendees were divided into five discipline-specific breakout groups, which included emergency management, fire/emergency medical services, health care/medical, law enforcement, and maritime to discuss regional gaps and training needs. The information obtained from the Training and Exercise Planning Workshop was incorporated into Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan.

On August 22, 2012, a Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan Review Meeting was conducted with the Regional Training & Exercise Program, SAIC and the Steering Committee to conduct a walk-through of the key strategies identified in the plan to assist stakeholders with implementing the Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan.

On August 31, 2012, the Multi-Year Training and Exercise Plan was completed and will encompass a three year period from January 2013 through December 2015.

Regional Overhead Planning Team

During the initial planning stages for the 2011 & 2012 Urban Shield full-scale exercises, a Regional Overhead Planning Team was established, which comprised multi-discipline planners and administrators from throughout the Bay Area UASI region. The Regional Overhead Planning Team established exercise scenarios to address core competencies and test regional gaps.

Post Exercise Reporting

The Alameda County Sheriff's Office has designated key personnel to serve as Homeland Security Exercise Evaluation Program (HSEEP) staff during the 2011 & 2012 Urban Shield exercises. The HSEEP staff ensured all relevant documentation was created to meet federal guidelines and produced After Action Reports (AARs) documenting regional strengths and areas for improvement in the Improvement Plan.

Periodic Reports

The Regional Training & Exercise Program produced monthly reports, as well as other reports or presentations, to the Bay Area UASI Approval Authority as requested, which contain pertinent information about the progress of the Regional Training & Exercise Program.

Training & Exercise Monthly Meetings

The Regional Training & Exercise Program has conducted monthly meetings with the Training & Exercise Working Group. Through increased representative outreach, the Training & Exercise Program has been able to increase multi-discipline attendance at these meetings.

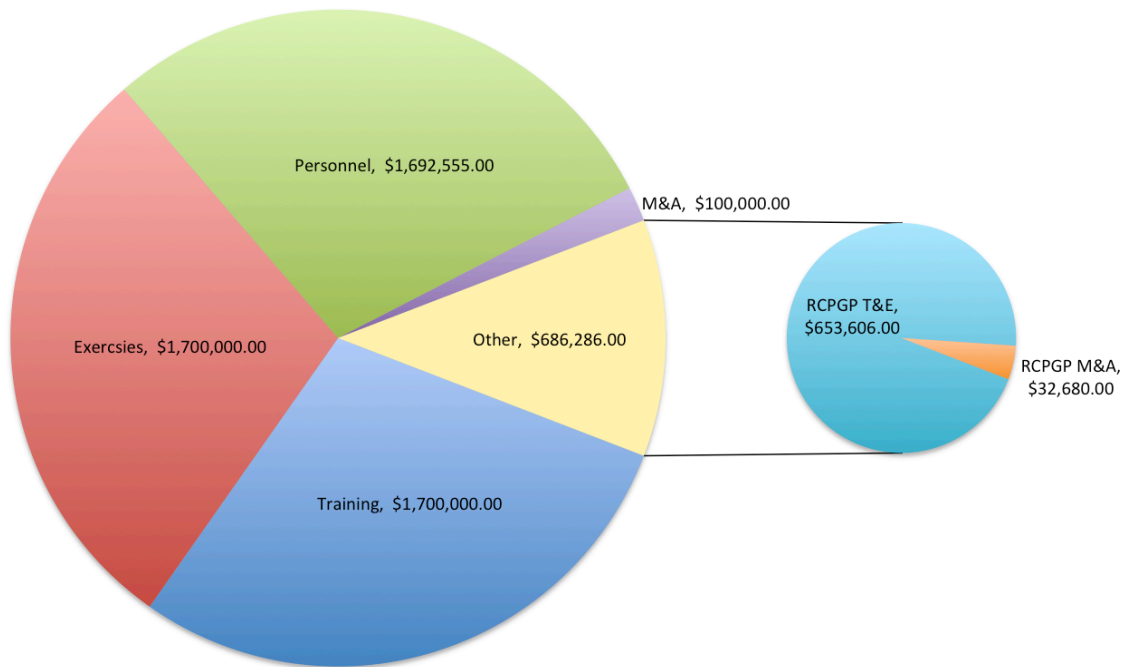
Budget

The Bay Area UASI Regional Training & Exercise Program was initiated with FY10 UASI Grant Funds in the amount of \$5,192,555, for the period of July 15, 2011 through December 31, 2012. Of that amount, \$1,700,000 was allocated to provide regional training, \$1,700,000 was allocated to provide regional exercises, \$1,692,555 was allocated to staff the program and \$100,000 was allocated for Management and Administration. In September 2012, as a result of salary savings, \$250,000 was re-allocated from personnel to training and the added funding was utilized to provide additional training for the Region. As of December 31, 2012, claims for training in the amount of \$1,737,817.72 were submitted, however; by the close of the FY10 UASI Grant performance period claims will have been submitted effectively exhausting the entire training allocation.

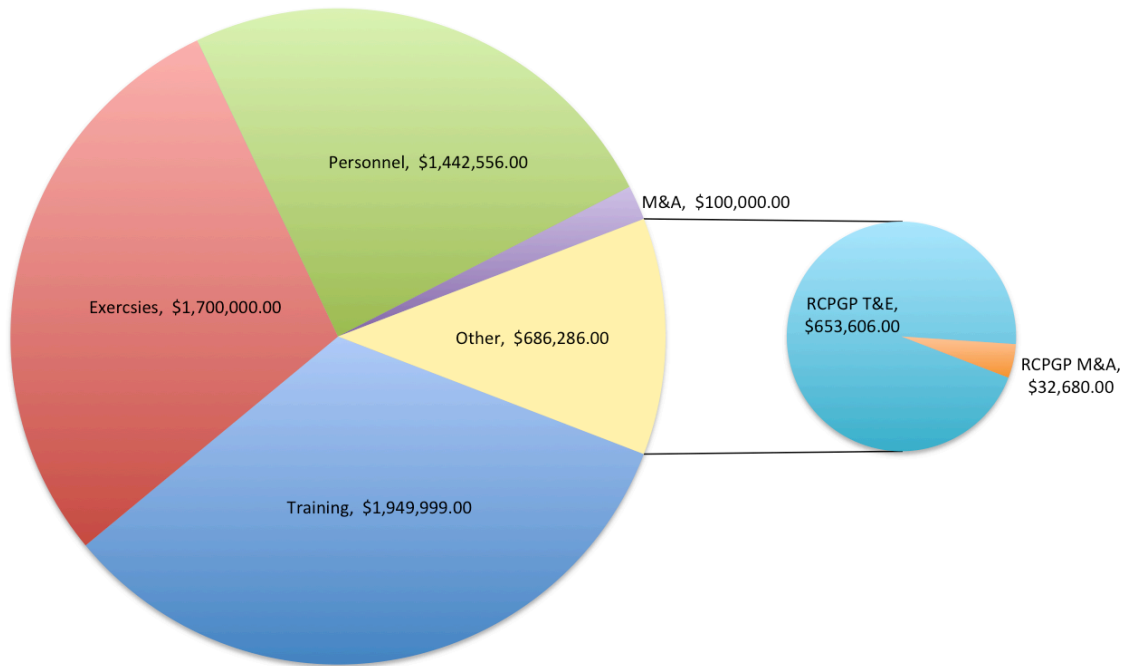
In July 2012, the Bay Area UASI requested the Alameda County Sheriff's Office to enter into an agreement to accept FY10 Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant funds in the amount of \$686,286 to deliver catastrophic preparedness training to the region. Of that amount, \$653,606 was allocated for training and \$32,680 was allocated for Management and Administration. An MOU was established and the agreement was executed in May 2012.

Bringing the RCPGP training funds under the purview of the Alameda County Sheriff's Office allowed the Regional Training and Exercise Program to use their established multi-year contracts and the program procurement process to expedite the delivery of training to the Region. Additionally, the UASI assigned the CBRNE Project Manager, Julie Linney, to the Regional Training and Exercise Program as a .5 FTE Training & Exercise Planner to manage the RCPGP training component. As of December 31, 2012, 28 RCPGP classes were provided to over 500 students throughout the region with the total cost of \$585,000. By the close of the FY10 UASI Grant performance period claims will have been submitted effectively exhausting the entire FY10 RCPGP training allocation.

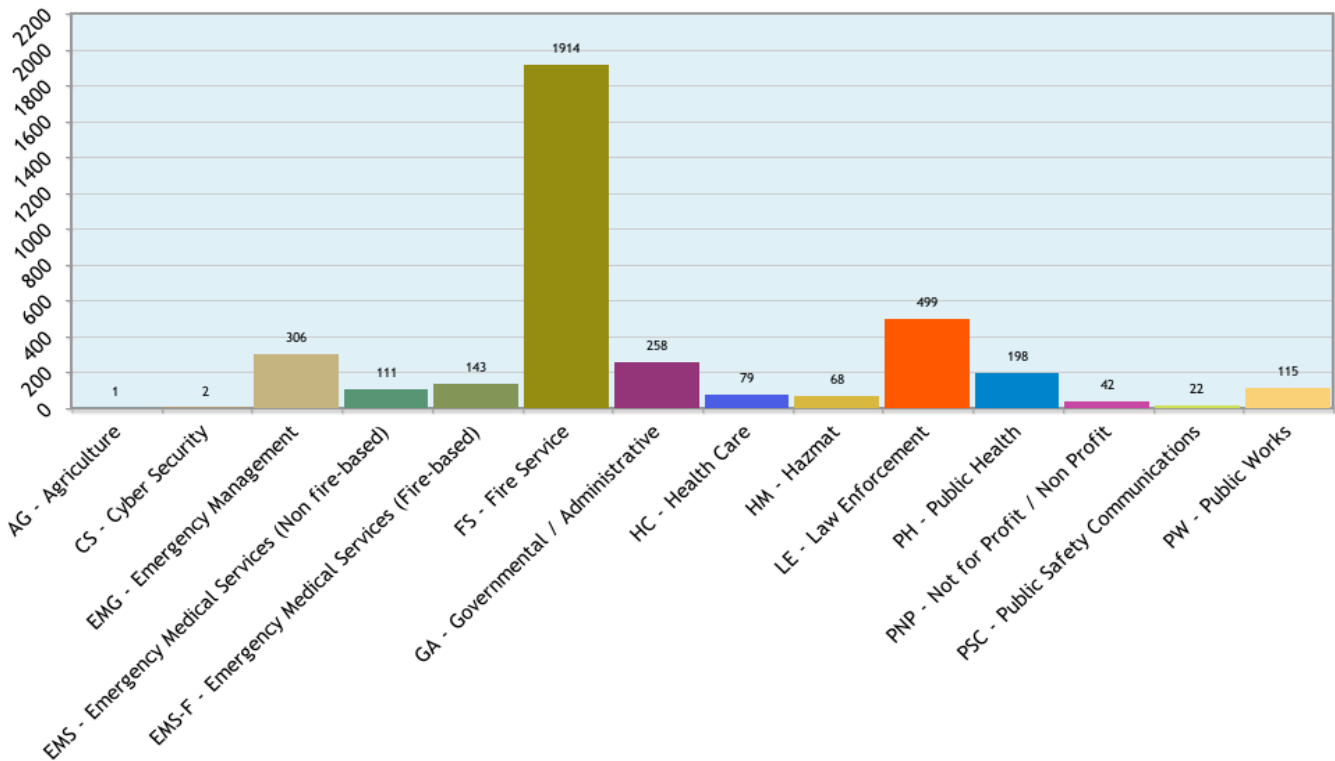

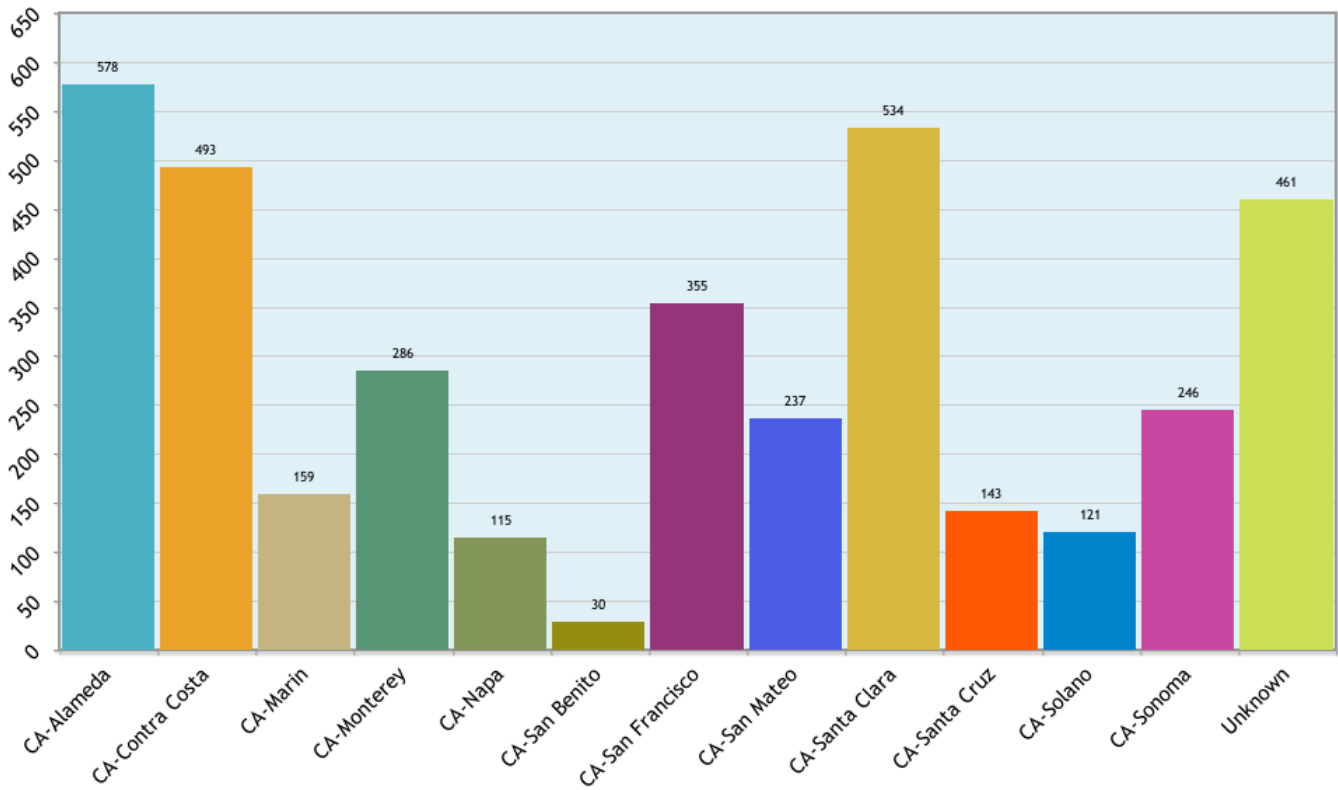

Students Trained by County (07/15/2011-12/31/2012)



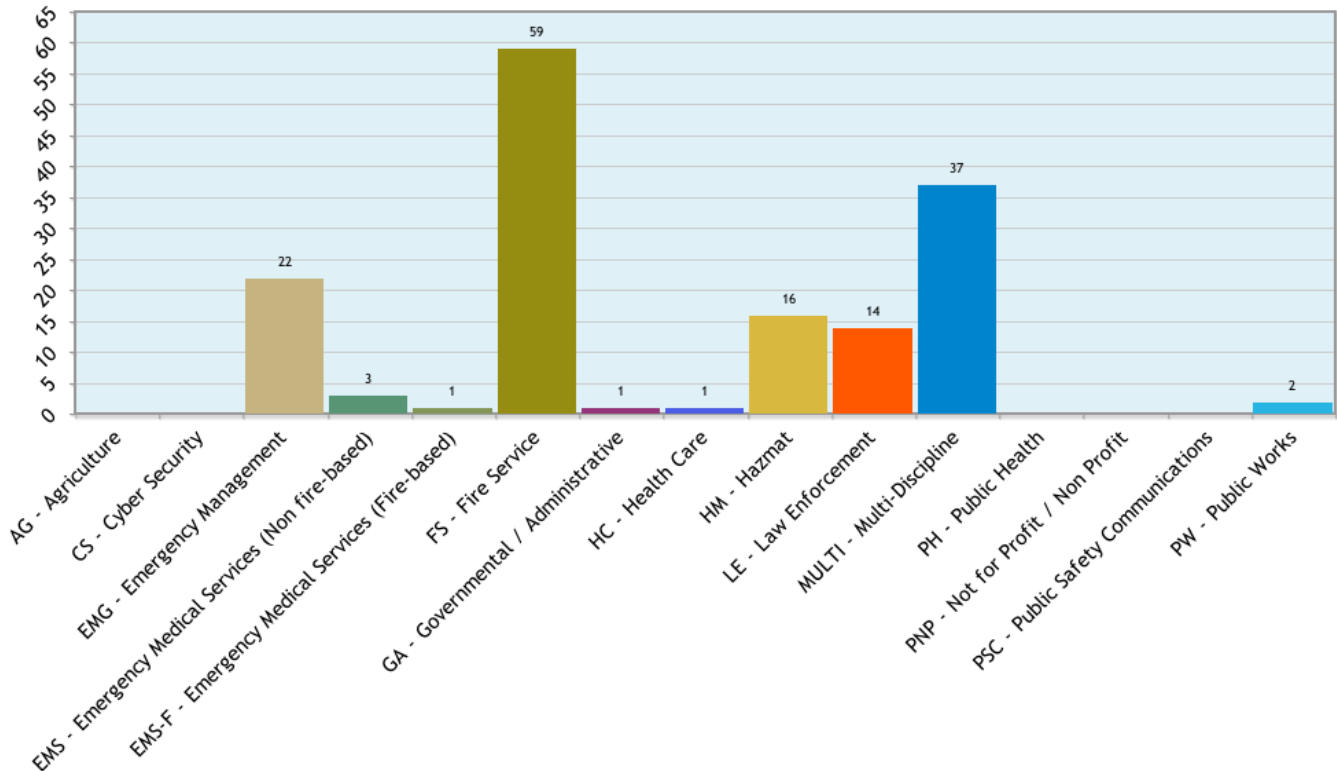

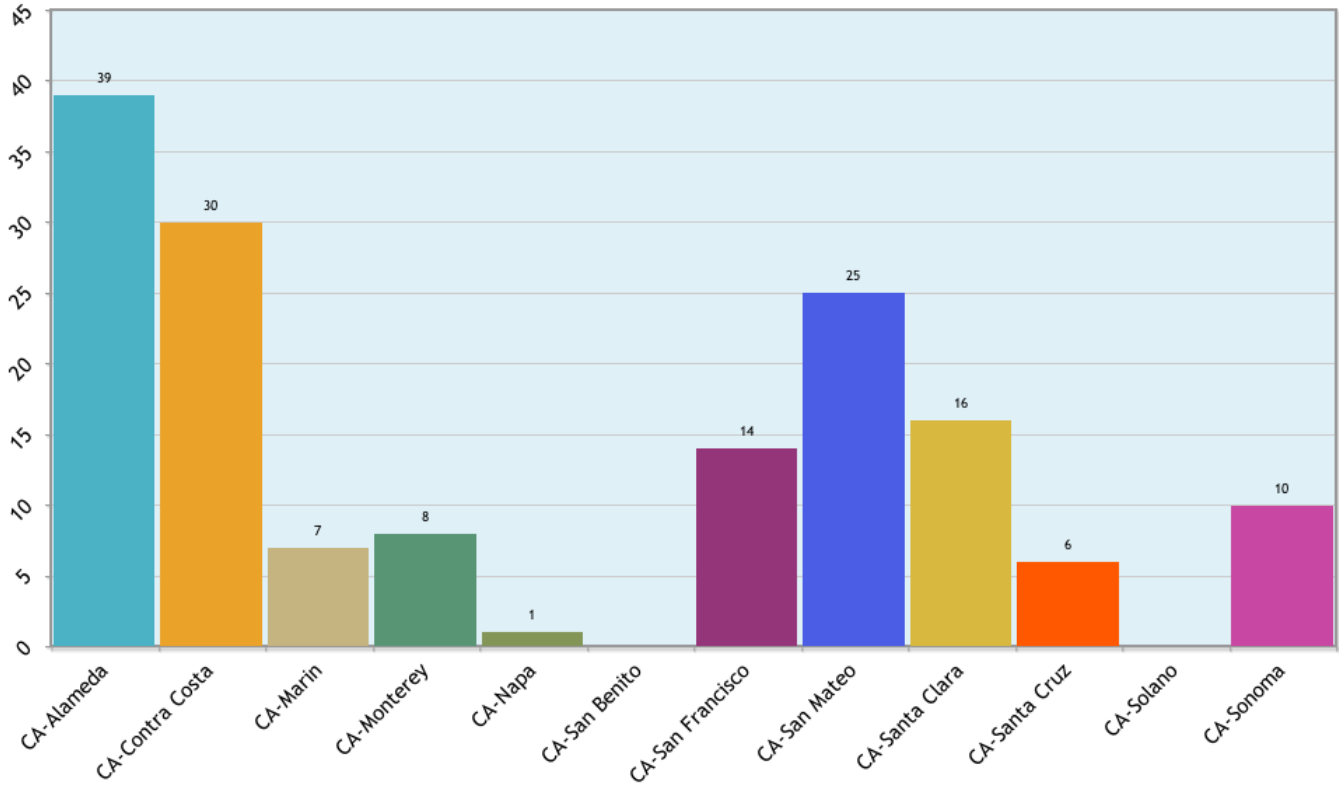

Exercise Summary

During the period from July 2011 through December 2012, the Bay Area UASI Regional Training & Exercise Program conducted two full-scale exercises, Urban Shield 2011 and Urban Shield 2012.

Urban Shield 2011



Urban Shield 2011 was a 48-hour continuous exercise, in which first responders were mobilized and deployed to 38 different exercise scenarios, hosted by 23 various agencies, and conducted throughout the Bay Area UASI Region in Alameda, San Francisco, and San Mateo Counties. These scenarios addressed the core competencies and response capabilities of law enforcement tactical teams, Emergency Medical Services providers, Hazardous Materials/Urban Search and Rescue teams, Explosive Ordnance Disposal teams, as well as addressing critical infrastructure concerns.

To accomplish this goal, the Exercise Planning Team developed one explosive ordnance disposal scenario, four HazMat/USAR scenarios, four medical checkpoint scenarios and twenty-six law enforcement tactical scenarios. These scenario locations were specifically identified and chosen to address concerns including critical infrastructure targets, privately owned infrastructure, the transportation sector, iconic structures, water treatment facilities, and the justice sector. Various UASI programs were evaluated during the exercise including the Northern California Regional Intelligence Center (NCRIC), Chemical Biological Radiological Nuclear Explosive (CBRNE) analysis, regional assets, etc.



As a result of this exercise, over 3,349 persons received crucial training and experience. In addition to the regional entities, a number of state and federal agencies, including, but not limited to, personnel from CalEMA, F.E.M.A., U.S. Coast Guard, National Guard, F.B.I., U.S. Marshals, and the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory actively participated. International involvement included the Kingdom of Jordan and the State of Israel, among others.

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) providers tested their ability to respond to an active shooter incident in a potentially hostile environment. The scenario required tactical teams to eliminate an active shooter threat and secure the scene. Once the threat was eliminated, the tactical teams were tasked with escorting EMS personnel into the scene from the staging area, providing close quarter force protection, while the EMS teams also provided initial triage and emergency medical treatment as warranted. The law enforcement tactical teams provided cover and protection while safely escorting the EMS personnel and the victims out of the building.



Fire department's Hazardous Materials (HazMat) teams participated in three scenarios designed to challenge their response capabilities by testing their equipment and core competencies. The first scenario was an illicit lab, including different methamphetamine manufacturing processes, bomb making and a Radiological component. The second scenario was a cargo trailer carrying nine unknown substances. The final scenario was to produce a plume model, shelter-in-place/evacuation and monitoring plan for a catastrophic release of 30,000 gallons of liquefied chlorine from a rail car.

Fire Department's USAR teams participated in four scenarios, three of which tested team's equipment and core competencies, and one which required the teams to make a concerted effort to share resources and skill sets to rescue trapped victims. The three individual scenarios were: 1) a high angle rope exercise creating a Telford line and removing victims over a simulated debris pile, 2) was a simulated damaged building that required teams to enter a building from the second story, and enter a confined space to perform a rescue on the first floor, shoring was required throughout the exercise, 3) was a breach of a simulated concrete tilt-up that needed to be shored and then breached to remove a victim below. The fourth scenario required a cooperative effort and was located at two separate buildings on a lot, one was a complete building collapse with several victims in various states of injury and entrapment and another was a damaged building that also had injured and trapped victims.



Law enforcement tactical teams were able to test their core competencies in the areas of domestic and international terrorist incidents, active shooters, hostage situations, dignitary protection, multi-hazard environments, mass transportation incidents, breaching, linear assaults, maritime interdiction, intelligence gathering and planning, amongst others.





Urban Shield 2011 operated under the principles of the National Incident Management System (NIMS), Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) and the Incident Command System (ICS) structure. Regional emergency management personnel controlled the exercise utilizing the emergency operation centers as area commands in San Francisco, San Mateo, and Alameda Counties as well as Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory. The Alameda County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (OHSES) served as the Department Operations Center (DOC).

Urban Shield 2012



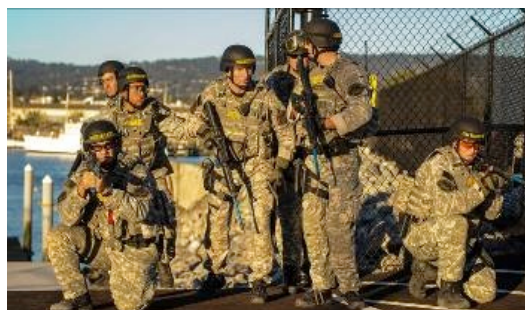
The overarching goals of Urban Shield 2012 was to provide a multi-layered training exercise to enhance the skills and abilities of regional first responders, our public and private partners, as well as those responsible for coordinating and managing large scale events. This exercise was designed to identify and stretch regional resources to their limits, while expanding regional collaboration and building positive relationships. In addition, this exercise provided increased local business and critical infrastructure collaboration. Urban Shield challenged the skills, knowledge and abilities of all who participated. It not only improved regional disaster response capabilities, but provided a platform for first responders on the national and international level, as well as the private sector, to work efficiently and effectively together.



Urban Shield 2012 was a 48-hour continuous exercise, in which first responders were mobilized and deployed to 47 different exercise scenarios, which were conducted throughout the Bay Area UASI Region in Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, and San Mateo Counties. These

scenarios addressed the core competencies and response capabilities of law enforcement tactical teams, Emergency Medical Services providers, Hazardous Materials/Urban Search and Rescue teams, Explosive Ordnance Disposal teams, as well as addressing critical infrastructure concerns. To accomplish this goal, the Exercise Planning Team developed three explosive ordnance disposal scenarios, twelve HazMat/USAR scenarios, four medical checkpoint scenarios and twenty-eight law enforcement tactical scenarios. These scenario locations were specifically identified and chosen to address concerns including critical infrastructure targets, privately owned infrastructure, the transportation sector, iconic structures, water treatment facilities, and the justice sector. Various UASI programs were evaluated during the exercise including the Northern California Regional Intelligence Center (NCRIC) and the East Bay Regional Communications System (EBRCS), among others.

As a result of this exercise, over 4,100 persons received crucial training and experience. In addition to the regional entities, a number of state and federal agencies, including, but not limited to, personnel from CalEMA, F.E.M.A., National Guard, F.B.I., U.S. Marshals, and the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory actively participated. International involvement included the Country of Brazil, among others.



Emergency Medical Services (EMS) providers tested their ability to respond to an active shooter incident in a potentially hostile environment. The scenario required tactical teams to eliminate an active shooter threat and secure the scene. Once the threat was eliminated, the tactical teams were tasked with escorting EMS personnel into the scene from the staging area, providing close quarter force protection, while the EMS teams also provided initial triage and emergency medical treatment as warranted. The law enforcement tactical teams provided cover and protection while safely escorting the EMS personnel and the victims out of the building.

Fire Department Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) and Hazardous Materials (HazMat) teams participated in twelve scenarios, including six for USAR and Six for HazMat. The scenarios were designed to challenge their response capabilities by testing their decision-making skills, core competencies, equipment and cooperation between first responders typically present at the scene of an emergency.

The six HazMat scenarios required teams to respond to a variety of situations. These ranged from responding to an Improvised Explosive Device with an unknown chemical release to a cargo container chemical release by terrorists. HazMat teams were tested on their ability to conduct assessments, rescue victims, identify unknown chemicals and odors and conduct decontamination. The HazMat teams also worked in conjunction with regional USAR teams



cooperatively, requiring the teams to work together to mitigate the threats presented to life and property.



USAR teams participated in six scenarios designed to challenge their response capabilities by testing their decision-making skills, core competencies, equipment and cooperation between first responders typically present at the scene of an emergency. In addition to the USAR team a local jurisdiction fire engine staffed with three firefighters, a police officer, a public works supervisor, an ALS ambulance staffed with two paramedics, and a ten person Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) team of which one is a ham radio operator also responded and helped to form a USAR task force.

Law enforcement tactical teams were able to test their core competencies in the areas of domestic and international terrorist incidents, active shooters, hostage situations, dignitary protection, multi-hazard environments, mass transportation incidents, breaching, linear assaults, Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) response, maritime interdiction, intelligence gathering, and planning, amongst others.



Urban Shield 2012 operated under the principles of the National Incident Management System (NIMS), Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) and the Incident Command System (ICS) structure. Regional emergency management personnel controlled the exercise utilizing the emergency operation centers as area commands in San Francisco, San Mateo, and Alameda Counties as well as Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory. The Alameda County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (OHSES) served as the Department Operations Center (DOC).
