## **Urban Areas Security Initiative**

The Federal Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) program assists high-threat, high-density urban areas in building and sustaining the capabilities necessary to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism.




## **Bay Area UASI**

» Twelve (12) operational areas/ counties

\*\*Projects must benefit at least two (2) operational areas.

- » Three (3) Core Cities:
  San Francisco, Oakland, and San Jose
- » Four (4) Hubs:
  North Bay, South Bay, East Bay, and
  West Bay







## **Bay Area UASI**

### FY24 & FY25 Estimated Hub Funding Allocations

East Bay \$2,952,942	(\$1,476,471 each year)
North Bay \$1,064,634	(\$532,317 each year)
South Bay \$3,186,582	(\$1,593,291 each year)
West Bay \$5,582,804	(\$2,791,402 each year)

Additionally, Core City funding is \$1,000,000 per year for San Jose, San Francisco, and Oakland

- » When will you be working on this project?
- » Which jurisdictions will the project serve?
- » Why is this project needed?

Projects for community-based and non-profits may be submitted through a government sponsor.

- » Cal OES Sole Source approval is REQUIRED if the cost is over \$250k. Otherwise, follow jurisdiction regulation.
- » Performance bonds are REQUIRED to purchase any single item over \$250k.

#### **Planning/ Personnel**

Covers a wide range of community preparedness & emergency management activities including the development, review, or revision of THIRA, SPR, or continuity of operations plans.

- » Each position must be submitted individually as a project with its own proposal.
- » Each position must include a specific deliverable that clearly ties to a Bay Area UASI Homeland Security Goal Area.
- » Positions are limited to a maximum of 14 months for each grant year.

#### **Organization/ People/ Teams**

Program management or operational support

Development of whole community partnerships

Structures and mechanisms for information sharing between the public and private sector

Salaries and benefits for intelligence analyst personnel



Planning | Organization | Equipment | Training | Exercise

#### **Equipment**

Include shipping and taxes!

Performance bonds required:

- » Any vehicles, watercraft or aircraft
- » Any piece of equipment over \$250K

Sole Source approval required for any equipment over \$250K

Portable equipment for water/aircraft does not require compliance approval. Installed equipment does!

Single, large equipment may not be split into two grant performance periods.



Typical legislative process: February

Two (2) separate MOUs will be issued, one for each grant year.

Remember: You can start preparing and submitting compliance approvals, but you may not complete a PO until you have a **fully executed** copy of the MOU!
